A motion was made by Commissioner Greenwald and seconded by Commissioner Gilmore to approve the aforementioned Mercantile License Applications. The motion carried.

REPORTS:

1. Commissioner Gilmore's Report – Commissioner Gilmore read the January 2008 Police Department Report, which included 14 alarms, 12 drug offenses, 16 MVA's, with a total of 510 calls received. He then read the Fire Department Report for January 2008, which included 3 drills, 1 elevator rescue and 5 motor-vehicle assists.
2. Commissioner Greenwald's Report – Commissioner Greenwald read the Construction Department Report for January which had permits totaling \$607.00. The total revenue for 2007 was \$54,000.00. He then indicated the

single stream recycling for the Dept. of Public Works is doing well, with 83,000 lbs. collected for January.

3. Engineers Report – Joe Federici, Borough Engineer indicated the Green Avenue paving project is basically complete. The 3rd Avenue project will begin in March, weather permitting. They are working on the plans for the 5th Avenue project to submit to NJDOT for approval. The Streetscape, Phase I portion is complete and Phase II has been submitted to NJDOT for review/approval. He then indicated the bids for Year 28 came in a little higher than expected so they will be reviewing same with the Commissioners to see what would be most feasible for the Borough.
4. Mayor's Report – Mayor Wolk read the Tax Collector's Report and gave an update on the Post Office. He indicated he sought the assistance of Congressman Andrews with regard to all the delays in the construction and opening of the Mt. Ephraim branch. At this point, the Post Office should open up in the next 2-3 weeks. Mayor Wolk then stated that he believed the purchase for the old lumberyard went through this past Friday, and there would be 38 units rather than the previously planned 42 units.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION:

Mayor Wolk acknowledged former Mayor Mike Reader, then opened the floor to the public for the public portion.

Karen Campannell, 20 Baird Avenue – Asked where the speed humps were going to be installed.

Commissioner Gilmore – Stated the speed humps would be installed on 4th Avenue, Northmont Avenue and James Street.

Hearing no further comments, Mayor Wolk closed the Public Portion.

ADJOURNMENT:
